Let k be a non-archimedean local field with ring of integers  $\mathfrak{o}$  and denote by  $G = \mathbf{G}(k)$  the k-rational points of a Chevalley group  $\mathbf{G}$  defined over  $\mathfrak{o}$ . The Steinberg, or special, representation of G is the irreducible admissible representation arising naturally from the action of G on the top cohomology space (with compact support) of the Bruhat-Tits building. We will examine the restriction of this representation to the maximal compact subgroup  $K = \mathbf{G}(\mathfrak{o})$  of G. (Received August 29, 2004)
