An L-space is a rational homology sphere with simplest possible Heegaard Floer homology; a group is left-orderable if it admits a strict total order of its elements that is invariant under multiplication on the left. It has been conjectured that being an L-space is equivalent to having a non-left-orderable fundamental group. This talk will discus some of the evidence for this conjecture, including joint projects with S. Boyer and C. Gordon, and A. Clay. (Received September 07, 2011)
