In many experiments and simulations, the observation has been made that, under rapid period pacing, cardiac cells undergo a period-doubling bifurcation in which the duration of action potentials alternates between a long value and a short value. While in a single cardiac cell this bifurcation is understood, even in a one dimensional cable of cardiac cells, its exact nature is still unclear. A model introduced by Mitchell and Schaeffer exhibits this so called alternan behavior. Like most models of action potentials, this model has both "fast" and "slow" timescales, resulting in a relatively stiff numerical problem. In 2 or 3 spatial dimesions, this makes mesh refinement inefficient. In this talk, I will discuss the results of applying a spectral deferred correction method to the reaction-diffusion system suggested by the model. In particular, I will focus on what the results say about the nature of these alternans and compare the efficiency of the method with the schemes currently used to solve the problem.
